Modern foreign languages in Key Stage 1 Children in Key Stage one start to develop an understanding of cultures other than our own through the wider curriculum and our school culture week. Important aspects of other cultures and languages (mainly French) are introduced and songs and phrases are established through classroom routines and assembly time. Modern foreign languages in Key Stage 2 Children in Key Stage two study French on a weekly basis with a specialist French teacher confident in the grammar and pronunciation of the languages. Key themes are taught and recapped through the key stage and a love of languages and foreign culture is established through extra-curricular visits and culture week.
